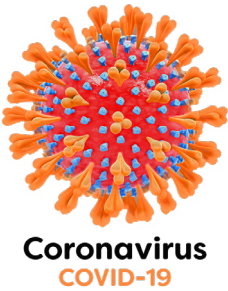

# Introduction



Coronavirus numbers in Wales are going up. There is a new type of coronavirus called Omicron. It is very easy to catch and is spreading very quickly.

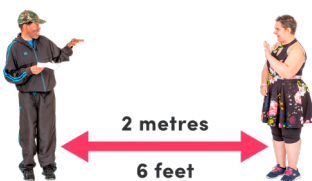


**The Welsh Government is bringing in new rules for Wales from 26 December to help stop the spread of the virus and keep Wales safe.**



## New Rules for Wales from 26 December:

Only 6 people can meet in public places.



You must keep 2m apart (3 steps) away from people in offices and public places.



New rules for businesses to protect customers and staff.

**x 30**

Up to 30 people can attend indoor events.

---

# x 50

Up to 50 people can attend outdoor events.



Nightclubs will close.

## How we can stay safe

### Get jabbed

Everyone in Wales who is eligible will be offered a third 'booster' jab by the end of December. It is really important to get your extra jab to help keep you safe from Omicron.



If you haven't had your first or second jabs – it's not too late.



Get all of your COVID-19 vaccines and boosters, and encourage those around you to get theirs too.

# Think carefully about who you meet and where you meet them



Try and reduce the number of people you meet, especially if you're seeing older or more vulnerable people.



Meeting outdoors is safer than indoors.



But if you do meet indoors, remember to open doors and windows to let in fresh air.



Space out your socialising – if you've got events arranged, try and leave at least a day between events.

## Get a test



If you're going to a wedding, civil partnership reception or a wake, take a lateral flow test before you go.



If you're going out shopping or visiting people – flow before you go. **Take a lateral flow test.**



If it's positive, you need to stay at home and self-isolate and **book a PCR test.**



## Don't forget

Wear a face covering in crowded spaces and all indoor public spaces.



Keep your distance from people you do not usually live with.



Wash your hands lots of times during the day.

Work from home when you can.



**Doing all these things gives the best chance of slowing the spread of the virus to Keep Wales Safe**
